Texas Christian University (TCU) is committed to providing a **positive learning, living and working environment free from discrimination and harassment.**

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Discrimination:

According to Equal Employment Opportunity Commission (EEOC), discrimination is unfair treatment because of your race, color, religion, sex (including pregnancy, gender identity, and sexual orientation), national origin, disability, age (age 40 or older), or genetic information.

Harassment:

A form of discrimination that is unwelcome verbal or physical conduct that is severe, persistent or pervasive enough creates a hostile, intimidating, or offensive environment for a protected class.

- Ethnic Origin
- Sex (including gender, pregnancy, sexual orientation, and gender identity)
- Age (40 or older)
- Physical or Mental Disability

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Title IX

No person in the United States shall, on the basis of sex, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination under any education program or activity receiving Federal financial assistance.



Mandatory Reporters

Mandatory Reporters

All community members, employees, and individuals in positions with authority that are responsible for promptly reporting violations or concerns about violations of laws, regulations, and University policies that come to their attention.

Role of Mandatory Reports

Promptly report violations or concerns about violations of laws, regulations and University policies that come to their attention to Title IX Coordinator and/or OIE
Respond to and collaborate with the Title IX Coordinator and/or OIE.

Mandatory Reporters Cannot

Mandatory reporters cannot promise to refrain from forwarding information to the Title IX Coordinator and/or OIE
Mandatory Reporters are not investigators.
Failure to provide such information to the Title IX Coordinator and/or OIE in a timely manner may result in further disciplinary action.



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Resources

Confidential Resources* are University Officials who can maintain legally protected confidentiality within the University for the individual who shared the information.

All community members, except Confidential Resources, are considered Mandatory Reporters.

***TCU's Confidential Resources** Licensed Mental Health Professionals at the Counseling Center, Licensed Medical Professionals at the Health Center, TCU Title IX Confidential Advocate(s), Ordained TCU Chaplains in the Office of Religious and Spiritual Life, Licensed physicians on TCU's Sports Medicine staff (for student-athletes)

REQUIRED COMPLIANCE TRAINING

Texas Christian University, in compliance with federal and state regulations, requires all new students to complete three online educational modules. New students, first year and transfers, are required to complete ALL courses by the first day of class, **August 21, 2023**.

Failure to complete the courses will result in a HOLD being placed on your student account, preventing any future enrollment.

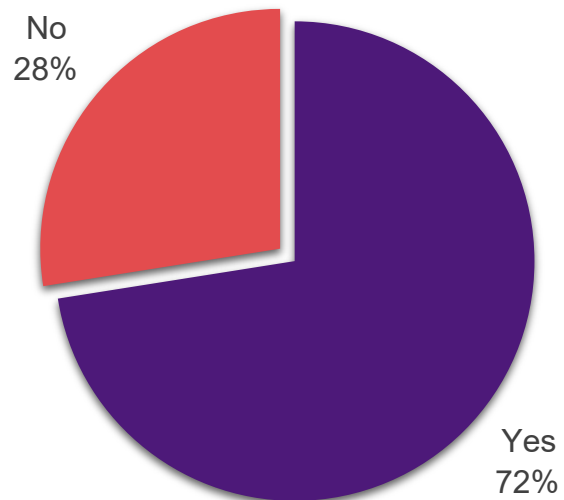
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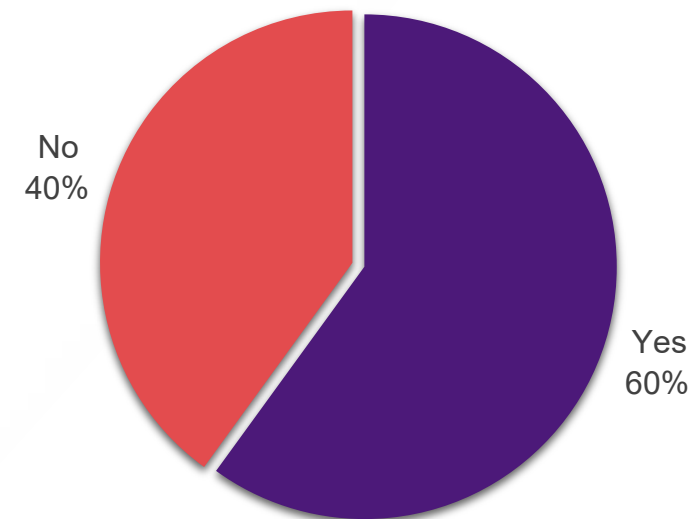
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Does “*everyone*” drink at TCU?

Desired vs. Undesired Outcomes of Use

- 80% say it enhances social activity
- 77% say it gives people something to do
- 71% say it allows people to have more fun
- 68% say it facilitates a connection with peers
- 43% say it makes it easier to deal with stress
- 26% say it makes them feel sexier
- 40% did something they regretted
- 24% performed poorly on a test or important project
- 17% were hurt or injured
- 12% thought they might have a drinking or other drug problem
- 11% were taken advantage of sexually
- 5.4% seriously thought about suicide

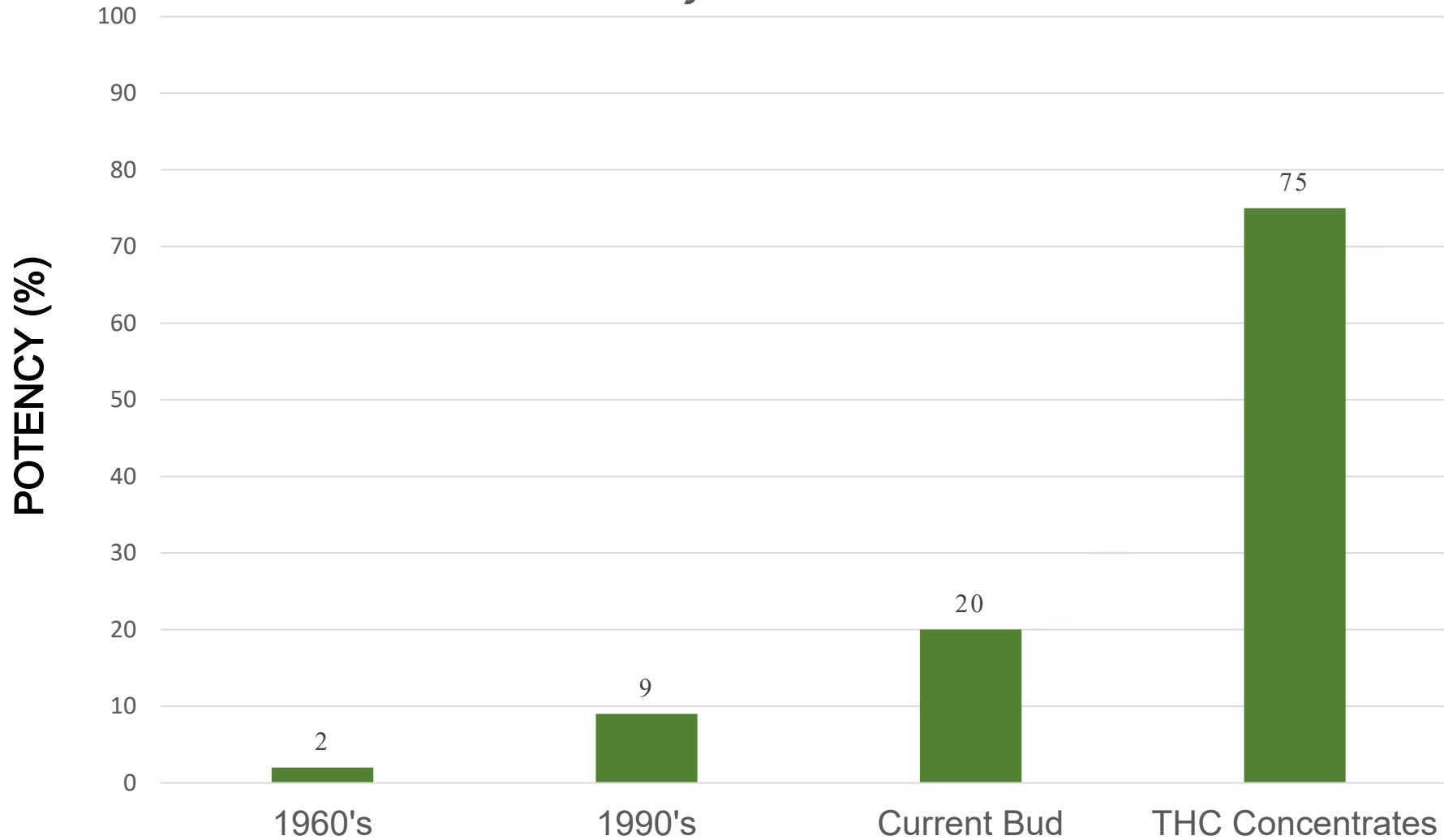

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Your student is *Under the Influence*.. of YOU!

- **Clearly communicate** your expectations of alcohol and drug use **BEFORE** your student comes to TCU
 - Parent permissiveness is linked to heavy episodic or “binge” alcohol use*
- As the perception of risk ↓ use ↑
- Help us avoid mixed messages
- Check in with your student throughout the semester; this is an ongoing conversation!
